Ryan Reynolds: Teacher. 7th year teaching here. Special Ed and Elementary Ed degree. Favorite subject/endorsement in Math. Very happy with the faculty at Providence

Mandy Donovan: Parent. Son in 4th grade, Social worker at the hospital

Barbara Miller: Teacher. Currently teaches 1st grade (always has). Focuses on a good foundation. That's where a lot of the money should go in her opinion. Anything that can help with that foundation (reading aides, etc.)

Kadie Clark: Teacher. This is her first full year teaching

Heather Anderson: Parent. Currently has a 4th grader and Kindergartner, teaches preschool and has a degree in Early Childhood Education

Carrie Kirk: Parent. Has 5 children; three here at Providence. Bachelors in Elementary Ed and Masters in Instructional Technology. Wants to be involved in SCC because that is where she thinks she can make the most contribution

#### **District Data Analysis follow-up**

Did data on the week of Halloween and gave the teachers the information

Need: More directions for the teachers and what we need to focus on

22 points (300 point scale) between an A and a B (we are a B school). We need to show growth between years. Third graders typically score so high that we see a dip in 4th grade (statewide)

#### **Bullying Discussion follow-up**

Ms. Wilson has read "The Juice Box Bully: Empowering Kids to Stand Up for Themselves" to each classroom (almost). The kids have signed a pledge and posted that in their classrooms. It has been a good springboard for the teachers to help discuss in their classrooms.

Panda Power assembly coming up

"Buddy Bench" may be implemented (where children who don't have anyone to play with can sit there and others can come play with them). Ms. Wilson is working on getting all the teachers on the same page and make it clear to the kids that it's a positive thing. An eagle scout wants to do that for his project.

Carrie Kirk shared that her daughter has dyslexia and has never been teased at school and she feels like the school does a great job preventing bullying.
