- 5. Volunteer at the local food pantry
- 6. Volunteer to babysit for someone you know in your neighborhood
- 7. If you love animals you could volunteer at the Cache Humane Society
- 8. Organize a litter patrol and clean up your neighborhood park or sidewalks (organize through your city to have clean up hours signed off)
- 9. You could volunteer at the Logan Zoo
